CIRKO'S SAFER SPACE GUIDELINES

- Treat everyone with equal respect regardless of gender, age, origin,
 nationality, language, religion or belief, opinion, political activity, health,
 disability, appearance, relationship, or sexual orientation. Do not repeat any
 stereotypes in the language you use: racism and discrimination are not part of
 our events. An exception to this is the language of a member of a
 marginalised group as an act of self-empowerment.
- Do not assume the gender, background, sexuality, ability, or financial situation of others.
- Everyone has the right to self-determination.
- Respect the physical and psychological boundaries of others. Always ask for verbal or otherwise-assured consent before touching someone else.
- Respect and listen to others. Intervene in inappropriate behaviour.
- Be mindful of your own assumptions: speak for yourself, not for others.
- Be mindful of your dominant position in relation to others and act accordingly.
- Take responsibility for your actions. Accept mistakes and disagreements.
- Give space. Make sure that everyone can see and hear the performers.
- If you're taking photos, make sure you have the consent of everyone visible in the frame.
- If you experience any threat, harassment, or discrimination, or if a situation feels uncomfortable, contact Cirko's staff.
